What programs do you offer?

The Study North colleges offer excellent and unique program choices. You can view the full list of programs that are offered through the Study North colleges on pages 6 and 7, or visit the individual college websites for detailed information on a specific program.

What do I need to get into a specific program?

Admission requirements vary between specific colleges and programs. In most cases, an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent is required. Graduate Certificate programs require a prior college or university certificate, diploma or degree for admission. In addition, colleges may establish program-specific admission requirements. Visit the colleges' websites to learn more about what is required for the program you would like to take.

Do these colleges have agreements with other colleges and universities?

All of the Study North colleges have negotiated a number of partnerships which allow students to utilize their credits for direct admission to programs at other colleges and universities. To view a list of transfer agreements, visit the individual school websites as their are many to choose from!

How/when can I apply?

To apply to a Study North college, you must complete an application form through ontariocolleges.ca. If you are currently enrolled in an Ontario secondary school contact your guidance counsellor for help with your application.

There is an application fee of \$95, and you must provide an official transcript. You can select up to five program choices, with no more than three program choices at any one college.

You can send in your applications starting in October, but be sure to have them in before February 1st for equal consideration!



How do I get there?

Though the colleges are located in five different cities in Northern Ontario, they are all accessible by bus or plane. You can also reach Sudbury by train with Via Rail. See our map on the back page to get an idea of where our colleges are located!

If you would like to tour one of our colleges and are travelling from somewhere outside of Northern Ontario, register for our **Study North Travel Incentives** on our website www.studynorth.ca/rebates and you could be eligible for a **\$500** rebate!

What is there to do in Northern Ontario?
